2016 EXAMINATION RESULTS

Our 2016 examination results were outstanding:

100% pass rate for A Levels

65% of A Level students gained A* - B grades.

100% A grades in A Level Maths, French and English Literature.

64% of Year 11 students achieved 5 A* - C's level including English and Maths - a new record for the school.

YEAR 7 TRANSITION

Year 7 students have settled into school life here at LHS very well. As part of their transition programme on Tuesday 4th October Year 7 students are going to Dinedor Outdoor Centre for a team building day. It's usually a great day out, fingers crossed the weather is kind!

YEAR 6 TASTER DAY

RUGBY

The Year 7 Boys have begun there sporting careers at LHS with a good showing at the first U12 County Tournament held at Whitecross School this week. After a busy couple of weeks in lessons and after school practices this was for most of the boys the first time they had been involved in a contact match. After narrowly losing the first game to Weobley the boys then went on to win their remaining 8 games and most importantly made a great deal of progress. This first tournament was staged as non-competitive to enable all the teams to get their first taste of playing against other schools. It will get more competitive as we move through the term, but on this showing it looks like the LHS boys can look forward with confidence.



Elsewhere on the rugby field all the other year groups have been in action over the last couple of weeks. The U14's had a comfortable win at Tenbury and the U16's were winning a very hard fought game at St Mary's before the game was abandoned due to an injury.
