Year 7 Historians had a great morning surveying the site of Lyonshall Castle. They carried out surveying techniques to hypothesise on the uses and development of the castle and the settlement over the centuries.

We were joined by Suzanne Hughes and Crispin from English Heritage to help further build up an understanding of the castle's construction, legends and history. Crispin demonstrated the skill of lime slaking to create mortar for the conservation of the castle, using the same techniques as were used over the castle thousand year history.
