Once a week, during tutor time, Year 10 students are either mentoring students in Year 7 or 8. In this time, the older students listen to their partner read, helping them with comprehension as well as pronunciation. Our older students are also seeing the value, with many of them using the project as the community contribution element of their Duke of Edinburgh award. THE LADY HAWKINS' GRAMMAR SCHOOL 'OLD BOYS MEMORIAL'

We are delighted that our plans for creating a memorial area to commemorate our 'old boys' who died in wars from 1914 are finally becoming a reality. Working with Tarmac, Kington Town Council, 'Kington Remembers' and other local organisations, we are hoping to place a standing stone and memorial slate stepping stones in a currently disused area of the school grounds. The stepping stones will be engraved with the names of the 'old boys' that we have identified as having died in the First and Second World Wars and in subsequent conflicts. We have identified twenty eight 'old boys' but may discover more as we research further.

Tarmac have kindly offered to provide a 'standing stone' which will be engraved and 'Kington Remembers' are providing a lot of the funding. We are hoping that the memorial garden and stones will be completed in time for the 75th anniversary of D-Day in June next year.
