Geography at LHS this term

Year 7 have looked at the physical and human geography of Kington. They have produced their own map of the school and where they live using digimap for schools. This is a great resource that the Geography Department subscribes to annually. It gives free



access to students, parents and staff to Ordnance Survey maps of anywhere in the U.K at any scale. You need to log on to the website below and the user name is HR59LE and the password is garped7235 https://digimapforschools.edina.ac.uk/



Year 8 have been looking at the different types of rocks and the processes of weathering and erosion which help to shape the landscape. They are now starting to look in more detail at the main landforms produced by rivers and ice.

Year 9 have been investigating natural hazards including hurricanes, tornadoes and volcanoes. They should be able to tell you what to do before and during a hurricane which could come in useful.

Year 10 have just finished their first topic on Rivers and Flooding. They have produced their own revision posters and now need to actively learn the key terms and case studies.

Year 11 have just finished looking at the Challenges of Urban Environments using Lagos and London as contrasting case studies. They now need to start revising this work along with their work from year 10 on climate hazards and climate change to prepare for their mock exams at the end of November.

Iceland 2020

25 Year 10 and 11 Geography students are going to Iceland for the trip of a life time in March 2020. The trip has been organised by Mr Smith and will take in some of the amazing sites this wonderful country has to offer. We will be visiting volcanoes, glaciers, geysers, waterfalls, beaches made of black ash as well as the plate boundary where Europe and America are spreading apart.

A big thank you to all parents who are supporting this trip financially, as well as to Mrs Cecil who has volunteered to come on the trip too. I will organise a meeting for parents and students before Christmas to finalise the arrangements

LHS 'Old Boys' Memorial

The unveiling and Service/Assembly is planned to start at 10.40am, with a two minute silence at 11am. As well as staff and students from Lady Hawkins' School and Kington Primary School, we will have Year 5s from various local primary schools present. The memorial will be unveiled by James Hervey-Bathurst, CBE, DL, High Sheriff of Herefordshire, and Cllr Bob Widdowson, Mayor of Kington, on behalf of Christine Forrester. It has been a true community project and the many



individuals and local businesses who have helped and contributed to the project will be invited. Most importantly, the local families related to some of the 'old boys' commemorated are also invited, so will hopefully be able to join us.

OTM Garden, Groundwork & Tree Surgery, Hay-on-Wye and Kington Building Supplies have just installed the magnificent standing stone and stone seat. These stones have been very kindly donated by Tarmac.

OTM are now going to place 30 stepping stones spiralling around the memorial stones. 26 of these stones carry the names of the 'old boys' that we have identified as having died in wars since 1914. Four stones remain blank so that if our research throws up any more names they can be added.

The stones have all been carved and inscribed by Paul Jones from The Stone Workshop in Weobley
