Primary Maths Challenge

Seven Teams from five different Primary Schools competed in the LHS Year 3 & 4 Maths Challenge solving some tricky problems. Congratulations to the winning team from Almeley Primary School.



Geography at LHS this term (13.2.20)

Year 7 have been looking at the weather in the U.K. They have looked at the different weather produced by anticyclones (areas of high pressure) and depressions (areas of low pressure), and also the effect that wind direction can have. They have also found out about the different types of rain and have produced their own cloud spotters' guide. They have also investigated the factors that affect micro climate and have applied this to the school grounds.

Year 8 have been studying Tropical Rainforests. They have looked at why Rainforests are so important to our planet, why they are being destroyed, and what we can do to help reduce the destruction. In particular they have found out about the impact that oil palm plantations have had on rainforests and the animals and people that live in them.

Year 9 have been investigating the causes and effects of Global Warming and what we can all do to help to mitigate it.

They have calculated their own carbon footprint (http://footprint.wwf.org.uk/? _ga=1.63204844.2107092822.1452084960 and have been given suggestions for how to reduce it.

After half term they will work out what they can do at school to help reduce climate change.

Year 10 have been working through a topic on Ecosystems, including Tropical Rainforests. They have looked at the causes and consequences (local and global) of deforestation in the Amazon, and strategies for managing rainforests sustainably. They have just started to look at the eco system of hot desert environments.



Year 11 have just finished looking at the topic of World Development which they now need to go over and learn. They are just finishing a look at the changing economy in the U.K and the rise of the tertiary and quaternary sectors. This is very relevant as they start to prepare for the world of work. They also need to continue revising their work from year 10 on rivers, coasts, ecosystems, natural hazards and climate change.





The Eco group has met several times this half term.

They have asked all students to make a pledge for how they will help to improve the school environment. These will be displayed in reception and after the holiday they will start to monitor how effectively these pledges are being carried out.



They are also taking part in a Show Your Love for the Planet event in Kington on February 14th. They made a picture out of post it notes on which students had written their messages and pledges for the planet

After half term they are focusing on increasing the number of plastic bottles that are recycled at school. This has been an ongoing issue and they really want to solve the problem. They are asking for any plastic bottles used at school to be put in a special bin in the canteen so they can be washed out by volunteers. They need to ensure that bottles are emptied and that lids are removed.
